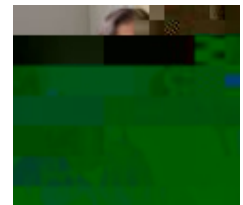

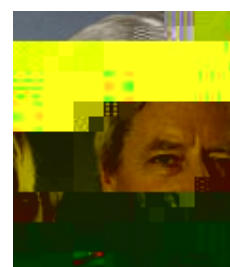
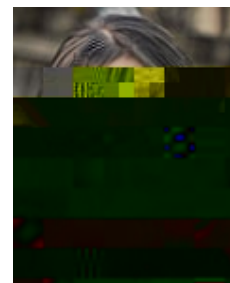

Chuck Hogan '89 is the **BYk TMf_ Hpa Yg** bestselling author of several acclaimed novels, including **8Yj JgTb'9 JYZHA Y?J Tbl' Accb** and **HA YGHUbXcZ**. His novel **DJpWczHA Jf Yg** was awarded the Hammett Prize for "literary excellence in the field of crime writing," and in 2010 was adapted into the film **HA YHkb** directed by and starring Ben Affleck, with Jeremy Renner, Jon Hamm, Rebecca Hall, and Blake Lively. His non-fiction has appeared in The New York Times, and his short fiction has twice been anthologized in **HA Y6Ygh** **5a YJMb'AngYfniGcfJYg** annual. He is also the co-author, with Oscar-winning filmmaker Guillermo del Toro (**Dbbg@UWhpb**) of the international bestsellers **HA YGHUp** and **HA Y: U**, published worldwide in twenty-nine languages. He lives outside Boston with his family.



Mr. Hogan will be joined in conversation by Christopher Wilson and Carlo Rotella of BC's English Department. Professor Wilson is a leading expert on American crime fiction. Professor Rotella, director of the Lowell Humanities Series, specializes in urban literature and culture.
